- I expect he in London.
(study, **will study**, have studied)

- **THE FORM OF THE VERB** : [*will + have + V.3*]

- **KEY WORDS:**

- **actions that will be completed before a particular time in the future:**

by the time + sub + V.1	→	will have + P.P
in + (عدد) + (زمن) + time	→	will have + P.P
by + then	→	will have + P.P

- **THE FORM OF THE VERB** : [*will + have been + V.3*]

- **KEY WORDS:**

- **to focus on a duration of action which is still ongoing at some point in the future:**

for + (عدد) + (زمن) + time + أحد مؤشرات المستقبل البسيط → will have + P.P

- I in Berlin for three years in July.
(had have lived, will have been living, will live)

The Future Continuous, the Future Perfect and the Future Perfect Continuous

are often used with:

by (2050, next year, then, the time, etc.) and **in** (ten years, two months, a few months)
(five years from now)

Other modal verbs can be used instead of **will** with Future Continuous and Future Perfect forms to show different degrees of certainty (**might, may, could**)

VI. PROBABILITY IN THE FUTURE

- **THE FORM:** [*be + adjective + to infinitive*]

- **KEY WORDS:**

- We can use certain phrases with the structure *be + adjective + to infinitive* to talk about how probable it is that a future prediction will actually happen:

be + (bound, certain, sure) → to infinitive (this is almost definite)

- When someone has lot of work, mistakes *are bound to* happen.
- I feel *certain* that you're doing the right thing.
- Her latest novel is *sure to* become a bestseller.

be + (likely) → to infinitive (this is probable)

- If I don't write it down, I *am likely to* forget.

be + (unlikely) → to infinitive (this is improbable)

- Nevertheless, the results *are unlikely to* be too far from the truth.
